	Trace each word on a family member's back and have them guess the word.
	Cut letters out of magazines and glue them on paper to build each word.

	(Math)
	Practice rote counting to 20. Practice writing your numbers 1-10.
	Practice counting objects in your home — beans, cereal, doors, windows, silver wear, etc.
	Play Counting Cup/Egg Carton game. (see directions)
	Highlight numbers in old magazines and newspapers.
	Practice typing your student identification/lunch number.
	Flip over cards in a deck one at a time and say the number as quick as possible.
	Write a number and draw objects to match the number. Repeat with numbers 1-10.

	(Reading)

	Talk about your favorite character.
	Retell the beginning, middle and end.

	(Writing) Have your child help you create a grocery list.
	Have your child write the names of who he/she played with at school.
	Draw a picture and write one sentence about the picture.

	Cut out a picture from a magazine and write a sentence about the picture.

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## Counting Cup/Egg Carton game

#### What You Need:

- Empty cups/egg carton
- Pen or marker
- Small food items (raisins, cereal, chocolate chips, candies) or objects (buttons)

#### What You Do:

Write the numbers 1 to 12 on the individual cups or sections of an egg carton. Have your child count out each number using small food items/objects.
